All junior swine exhibitors will be required to attend an exhibitor's meeting on Monday August 10th at 6:45 pm. Rules and expectations will be reviewed, discussed and strictly enforced thereafter.

GENERAL JUNIOR SWINE RULES

- 1) **New for 2009 a copy of the official breed registration papers and/or crossbred gilt certificates for breeding gilts must accompany entry forms and proper fees.** Entries, with the proper fees, must be submitted through your Wisconsin State Fair County Youth Participation Contact. Entries sent directly to Wisconsin State Fair will not be accepted. Entry forms must contain complete information for breeding animals including class number, birthdate, ear notch, name and registration number. Any entries without proper information will be returned. See the "Junior General Rules and Regulations" section on www.wistatefair.com for eligibility requirements and additional rules.
- 2) MAQA certification is required in order to exhibit swine at Wisconsin State Fair. This can be achieved through the Youth Meat Animal Quality Assurance Program. Contact your local extension office for information. The deadline your certification needs to be documented through the WI MAQA database is July 31, 2009.
- 3) An exhibitor may enter and show a total of 6 swine (gilts and barrows) with no more than 2 being barrows. **Barrows may be eligible to show in the market division, bred and owned division and the performance division if the barrows meet the respective division qualifications and are entered appropriately.** A junior exhibitor may only enter and receive premiums on 2 animals per class. Substitutions within classes will be permitted providing the animal was eligible at the time entries were made.
- 4) Junior Exhibitors may enter the same breeding animal in both the Open and Junior Show. Open and Junior fees must be paid for on separate checks or money orders accompanied by proper entry forms. Open Show entries with the correct fees must be postmarked by June 16th. Junior Market Barrows may be entered in the open Badger Classic and Open Jackpot shows but cannot be exhibited in them if they are shown in the Junior Market barrow show because the Junior Market Barrow show is terminal.
- 5) The Swine Superintendent will assign pens by county and use the following stalling criteria based on the number of **hogs exhibited** at the show per exhibitor:
 - 2 head = 1 Pen
 - 3-4 head = 2 Pens
 - 5-6 head = 3 PensCounties must work together using the space allotted. *Exhibitors are encouraged to bring their own pen dividers if necessary.
- 6) All swine must be checked in by the swine staff on Monday, August 10th as listed above. The Superintendent reserves the right to post and or announce any changes to the check-in schedule.
- 7) All exhibitors are required to have pens cleaned by 7:00 am each day. Straw and/or paper bedding are discouraged. All exhibitors are requested to keep show equipment or feed/bedding supplies in pens. The aisles must remain clear.
- 8) Exhibitors must show their own animals unless prior approval has been granted by the Superintendent.
- 9) No firm or farm name identification shall be carried, worn or displayed on exhibitor or animal while in the make up area or the show ring. Failure to comply with this regulation will permit the Superintendent to bar the exhibitor from showing until the regulation is complied with.
- 10) Fitting is limited to the exhibitor, his/her mother, father, sister, brother, step-parent or legal guardian (with proof of relationship) or other junior exhibitor participating in the Wisconsin State Fair Junior Shows. Fitting includes, but is not limited to, the day to day management practices of feeding, exercising, and show preparation. Exhibitors and the appropriate family members listed above are the only personnel allowed into the designated show ring class make-up/lineup areas. Clipping of pigs is not allowed on the Fairgrounds. The Wisconsin State Fair Fitting Superintendent and staff have the right to interpret these rules.
- 11) Misrepresentation in regard to any part of this contest will disqualify the exhibit and premiums may be withheld until proof of the eligibility is established.

- 12) Due to animal welfare and safety issues all swine brought to the Wisconsin State Fairgrounds are restricted to the Swine Barn only. Any animals found outside of the designated area will be immediately disqualified. Department Superintendent(s) will have discretion to approve special circumstances.
- 13) Registration papers: All purebred swine must have original or breed association issued duplicate copy of individual registration papers present at the time of check in. The identification and ear notch indicated on the registration certificate must correspond with the animal. Litter recording or individual registration will be accepted if they comply with the specific breed association guidelines or rules. Faxes, emails, photocopies or telephone calls from the breed associations will not be accepted.
All swine must have legible and fully healed ear notches. The ear notches must be free of scabs or evidence of being freshly cut. All pigs not properly registered or ear notched will be moved to the crossbred division or not allowed to show.
All Berkshire swine must be registered by the American Berkshire Association.
- 14) All Junior breeding stock entries must be owned, in possession and registered in the name of the exhibitor by May 1 or have a Wisconsin State Fair Junior Livestock Managerial Agreement Form on file at your local County Extension office no later than June 2nd.
Ownership requirements are met when the exhibitor's full name appears on the animal's registration paper (including transfers). Co-ownership is allowed between immediate family members (i.e. mother, father, legal guardian, sister or brother). Flock/Ranch/Farm names are allowed but only if the junior exhibitor's full name also appears on the registration paper(s) (including transfers). A breed Association verification stating Flock/Ranch/Owners will be allowed if space is not permitted on the registration paper.
Managerial - A managerial breeding animal is an animal under the daily care and supervision of, but not owned solely by the exhibitor. These animals must be carried as a project animal by May 1st of the current show year. An exhibitor is allowed multiple managerial agreements but is limited to exhibiting only two managerial breeding animals per in the Junior Swine Department at the Wisconsin State Fair. Managerial animals are not allowed in the market show. Managerial animals need to be identified with the County Agent on a Wisconsin State Fair Livestock Managerial Form by June 2nd. The County Extension Office will also file a copy of the agreement with the Wisconsin State Fair Agriculture Department, 640 S 84th St, West Allis, WI 53214 by June 5th. Managerial identification forms need not accompany the animal to the Fair, but must be kept at the county 4-H office until 30 days after the Fair.
No Managerial Forms Required if an exhibitor is entering/showing breeding stock registered only to his/her immediate family (mother, father, legal guardian, sister or brother) or the family Flock/Ranch/Farm name and the exhibitor's full name does not appear on the registration paper (including transfers).
Managerial Form Required if the exhibitor is showing an animal which is co-owned or owned by someone other than an immediate family member (mother, father, legal guardian, sister or brother) or the family Flock/Ranch/Farm.
- 15) Wisconsin State Fair Management reserves the right to interpret all rules and regulations.

New for 2009 a copy of the official breed registration papers and/or crossbred gilt certificates for breeding gilts must accompany entry forms and proper fees. Breed divisions must have a minimum of 2 exhibitors and 5 head to have an individual breed show. Breeds whose entries do not meet these requirements will show as Any Other Breed (AOB).

All **crossbred gilts** must be identified by the acceptable ear notch system in both ears and accompanied with a crossbred gilt certificate at the time of entry. Certificates are available online at www.wistatefair.com. Crossbred gilts will be weighed and will show by weight. Gilts weighing over 350 lbs will not be allowed to compete for champion.

A Champion Bred & Owned Gilt will be selected in each breed from the highest placing bred & owned animals in each class.

JUNIOR MARKET BARROW DIVISION RULES

- 1) Entry fee: \$6.00 per head. The junior market barrow rules are in addition to those listed in the “Junior General Rules and Regulations” located on www.wistatefair.com and the general swine rules listed in the “Junior Swine” entry information.
- 2) The junior market barrow show is open to exhibitors who have DNA identified their barrows on April 18 or April 25, 2009 at the respective Wisconsin State Fair sites. There are no minimum or maximum weight requirements. Junior ownership is established at this time.
- 3) The junior market barrow division is a terminal show. Payment information for all market barrows will be provided when a marketing agent has been secured.
- 4) **Each exhibitor will be permitted to bring no more than 2 barrows total to the Fair to show in the market barrow division, the bred and owned division and the performance division. Barrows may be eligible to show in any or all of the above divisions if they meet the respective division qualifications.** Check-in and weighing of barrows will begin at 11:00 am, Monday August 10th. All barrows must weigh between 230 -300 lbs to show in respective market barrow breed divisions. Pigs weighing 229 pounds or less and 301 pounds and over will be shown by weight class (heavy weight or light weight) regardless of breed, these barrows are not eligible for Champion and are still considered terminal.
- 5) No livestock scales will be allowed on the Wisconsin State Fair grounds. Livestock scales found on the grounds will be confiscated by Wisconsin State Fair officials. Exhibitors using an unofficial scale will be disqualified from participating in any market show.
- 6) Purebred Barrow Registrations: All purebred barrows must have individual registration papers present at Wisconsin State Fair check-ins on August 10th. Co-ownership is allowed between immediate family members (i.e. mother, father, brother, sister). Flock/Ranch/Farm names are allowed but only if the junior exhibitor(s) full name(s) also appears on the registration paper(s) (this also includes transfers). A breed Association verification stating Flock/Ranch/Owners will be allowed if space is not permitted on the registration paper. Barrows without purebred papers will be shown as crossbreds. Breed classes need ten head checked in at the Fair to qualify for an individual breed division. Market barrows with insufficient numbers but having breed verification will be placed in the Any Other Breed (AOB) division. Purebred barrows of the following breeds; Duroc, Hampshire, Yorkshire, Berkshire, Poland China, Spotted, Chester White and Landrace will be subject to random DNA testing for parentage. Any purebred barrow that is found to have different parents than what is identified on the original registration paper presented at check-in will be disqualified and all premiums earned will be forfeited.
- 7) Barrows are subject to random DNA identification testing. The Junior Swine Superintendent may elect to DNA test any barrow at any time.
- 8) All junior market exhibitors are expected to stay until Thursday, August 13th to load their animals on the designated Wisconsin State Fair truck going to harvest.
- 9) The Grand, Reserve Grand and all Champion Breed barrows will be sold at the Governor’s Blue Ribbon Livestock Auction on Wednesday, August 12th. See the Governor’s Blue Ribbon Livestock Auction section for more information. Animals sold at a County Fair Auction can only participate in the Governor’s Blue Ribbon Livestock Auction if the “Show Rights Ownership Statement” (found in the Governor’s Blue Ribbon Livestock Auction section on www.wistatefair.com) is completed and filed with the GBRLAC prior to the sale.
- 10) **Weigh-backs:** For informational purposes, all first blue, first red and first white placing entries will be required to weigh-back after their class. The weigh-back information will not be used to penalize animal placing or judging in any way unless the exhibitor refuses to comply with the weigh-back requirement. In this case the exhibitor and animal will be disqualified from further competition and receiving all awards earned in this division.

The Performance Barrow Division is a combination of a live show (30%) and a lean lbs gain contest (70%). The overall Performance Division Award winners will be announced during the Grand Champion Drive in the Coliseum on Wednesday August 12th.

- 1) Barrows must be entered in the Performance Barrow Division on the Wisconsin State Fair Junior Swine Entry Form. Entry fee is \$10.00 per head. Performance barrows are eligible to exhibit in the market barrow and the bred and owned barrow divisions with additional entry fees and appropriate entry on the junior entry form.
- 2) Barrows must have weighed in at 60# or under at the identification sites on April 18th or 25th. Exhibitors may identify an unlimited number of barrows but may enter no more than 2 in the performance division. Barrows may be identified and shown in both the performance and the market barrow divisions. Performance barrows are subject to all rules for drug residue and unethical practices listed in the Wisconsin State Fair Junior Rules and Regulations.
- 3) Barrows will be weighed-in on Monday, August 10th and ultra-sounded on Tuesday, August 11th. This show is terminal.
- 4) Live Show Component: Performance Barrows will show by weight only.
- 5) Lean Pounds Gain Component: Pork carcasses will be ranked via their ultrasound based calculation of "Lean Gain per Day" on test. This calculation takes into account the animal's rate of gain as well as the animal's level of fatness and muscling.

BREED ASSOCIATION AWARDS

The **American Berkshire Association**, PO Box 2436, West Lafayette, IN 47996-2436 will offer a plaque to the overall Grand Champion market barrow live and/or carcass if the animal is from a recorded Berkshire litter and the Association is supplied a photo and story within 30 days of the show.

The **Chester White Swine Record Association**, PO Box 9758, Peoria, IL 61612 will pay \$50 to the exhibitor of the Grand Champion barrow over all breeds in the junior show provided it is a Chester White out of a recorded litter and a picture is supplied by the winning exhibitor.

The **National Swine Registry**, PO Box 2417, West Lafayette, IN, 47996-2417 is a consolidation of the American Yorkshire Club, American Landrace Association, Hampshire Swine Registry and United Duroc Swine Registry.

The National Swine Registry offers \$50 to the owner of the Grand Champion barrow over all breeds in the on-foot show provided the barrow is a registered Duroc, Hampshire, Landrace or Yorkshire and is from a recorded litter. The owner must provide proof of registration and a picture to receive the award.

The National Swine Registry offers \$50 to the owner of the Grand Champion carcass over all breeds provided the carcass is a registered Duroc, Hampshire, Landrace or Yorkshire. The owner must show proof of a matching ear notch with registration paper to receive the award.

All award winners must submit proof of registry and supply appropriate picture to the National Swine Registry within 60 days of the show to receive their awards.

The **National Spotted Swine Record**, Inc., PO Box 9758, Peoria, IL 61612, will award a trophy to the owner and exhibitor of the Grand Champion barrow over all breeds provided the exhibitor is a member of the National Record and the barrow is from a verified litter reported with the National Record. The National Spotted Swine Record, Inc., will award a trophy to the owner and exhibitor of the Grand Champion barrow over all breeds if a crossbred is sired by a recorded Spotted Boar. Awards will be made on receipt of notice show officials.

The **National Tamworth Association** will award a banner for the Champion and Reserve Champion barrow and breeding gilt in the junior show.

The **Wisconsin Duroc Breeders Association**, Arlan Butts, Secretary/Treasurer, Evansville, WI will pay \$20 to the exhibitor of the Champion Duroc barrow of the junior show and \$25 if the barrow is Grand Champion barrow of the junior show.

The **Wisconsin Spotted Breeders Association**, Norm Ries, Secretary, W10964 Butternut Rd, Lomira, WI 53048, will award a plaque or trophy to the owner and exhibitor of the Reserve Champion Spotted Barrow in the junior show.

- 1) Only exhibitors in the department are eligible for the Swine Showmanship Contest. Entry in showmanship is required by June 30, utilizing the Wisconsin State Fair Junior Swine Entry Form. Entry in Showmanship must be confirmed during county animal check-in.
- 2) Exhibitors must exhibit his/her own animal entered and checked in for one of the individual classes. The same animal must be used in all heats and finals.
- 3) Fitting is optional.
- 4) Exhibitors' age as of January 1st will be used for determining age division. The Superintendent will post class order at the Fair.
- 5) The Superintendent reserves the right to break any class with more than 10 participants into heats. Exhibitors will be randomly assigned to heats. The judge will select the top showpersons in each heat (quantity at the judge's discretion) to advance to the final class for that particular age class.

- 6) Premiums for the finals will be paid on straight placing. Participants not selected to advance from preliminary heats will receive a \$5.00 premium.
- 7) Exhibitors are encouraged to wear a Wisconsin State Fair sponsored showmanship shirt if available.

**HERDSMANSHIP
DIVISION 16**

In an effort to effectively promote their projects and the industry to the public, the care and presentation of county exhibits must be of high standards at all times during the Fair.

Every county which has junior exhibitors at the Wisconsin State Fair will be monitored for county herdsmanship by the Wisconsin State Fair Swine Department Staff. Herdsmanship will be based on decorations, appearance and cleanliness of display area, care given to animals, and general cooperation and attitude of exhibitor. All exhibits/exhibitors are required to use the uniform identification card furnished by the Wisconsin State Fair or an equivalent in their exhibit.

County exhibits not displaying satisfactory herdsmanship as determined by Wisconsin State Fair management using the herdsmanship criteria will be subject to the following consequences:

1st warning – County chaperone will receive written warning indicating the exhibit needs improvement.

2nd warning – County chaperone will again receive a written warning indicating improvements needed in exhibit. County agent will be contacted.

3rd warning – County or specific individuals will receive a written letter of reprimand noting the lack of compliance by the county or said exhibitors for presenting a positive image of the project to the company.

The county or youth involved will be immediately released from the Fair and will lose all premiums or awards won. A report detailing the three warnings will be filed with the Agriculture Director. The Agriculture Director will present the issue to the respective committee for possible future disciplinary actions.
