

REGULATIONS FOR ALL YOUTH PARTICIPANTS 2011 Wisconsin State Fair

Thousands of Fairgoers visit State Fair each day. The people and excitement of the Fair can distract you from the real reason you are at State Fair: to learn and grow as an individual and to represent Wisconsin Youth Organizations in the best possible way.

Your county leaders and parents are counting on you to be responsible and mature enough to handle any temptations you might encounter. Make a conscious decision to "play it smart" during State Fair. You will be glad you did. Below are some simple "do's and don'ts" to follow while at State Fair.

DO:

1. Wear your Youth Center wristband at all times.
2. Keep valuables in a safe place. Leaving them unprotected is risky.
3. Know your adult chaperone and State Fair Coordinators and check in with them regularly.
4. Bring your own bedding/toiletries. (Sleeping bags work best!)
5. Treat the Youth Center with respect. Keep it clean!
6. Be a good role model for other youth.
7. Maintain a neat and proper appearance at all times. Going barefoot in the lobby and cafeteria is not acceptable.
8. Abide by evening curfew hour of 11:00 pm for Youth Center lodging. Curfew means exhibitor must be in assigned youth center room. Chaperones will make bed checks between 11:15 and 11:30 pm. Quiet hours are to be observed from 11:30 pm to 5:00 am. Participants returning from or reporting for barn duty are not to cause any disturbance when entering or leaving the Youth Center.
9. Attend meal hours at the specified times:

Breakfast	6:00 - 7:30 am
Lunch	11:00 - 1:00 pm
Supper	5:00 - 6:30 pm
10. Stay healthy! Take care of your body by drinking plenty of fluids, eating regularly and allowing enough time for adequate sleep. Report illness or injury promptly to your chaperone or youth center staff. Medical staff are on-site at the Fair Park but not available in the Youth Center.
11. **Check out with Youth Center Staff supervisor before leaving for home.** Participants must check out of rooms by 8:00 am. Your personal belongings can be kept in the Youth Center first floor lobby observed by the Camp Ammon Staff if necessary.

DO NOT:

1. Lose, mutilate or pass your Tommy G Thompson wristband to another person. Replacements cost \$23.00 each day. Bring your chaperone with you if a replacement is needed.
2. Wear clothing with objectionable slogans or print.
3. Use any form of offensive language.
4. Deface or damage property.
5. Smoke or use tobacco products.
6. Consume alcohol or other drugs.
7. Participate in hazing, "initiating", harassment, or in treating other exhibitors disrespectfully. Doing so may result in you being sent home from the State Fair.
8. Visit Youth Center rooms of members of the opposite sex.
9. Leave Wisconsin State Fair Park grounds without chaperone permission.
