RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1) **Entry:** All exhibitors must have valid admission to enter the Fair Park August 4 – 14. Admission fees do not include vehicle parking! Entries, with the proper fees, must be submitted to Wisconsin State Fair prior to June 16th. Entries without proper information will be returned. All exhibits will receive the best care and protection the surroundings will afford but they are at all times subject to the owner's risk.
- 2) **Stalling:** Since stalling capacity is limited, stalling will be at the discretion of the Wisconsin State Fair Draft Horse Superintendent, regardless of stalling requested with entries. Wisconsin State Fair will notify exhibitors if their stalling assignments are different than what was requested. Wisconsin State Fair reserves the right to discuss entry and stalling with Breed Associations or other designated committees/personnel. In instances where entries are rejected or stalling requests are not available, a full refund will be provided by September 30th. The following preferences are used when determining stalling:
 - A. Allow exhibitors who enter on time the opportunity to participate
 - B. Entries which include hitches
 - C. Past exhibitor attitude, husbandry practices, use of space and class participation
 - D. Wisconsin exhibitors based on seniority of showing at the Wisconsin State Fair
 - E. Out-of-State exhibitors based on seniority showing at the Wisconsin State Fair
 - F. New Wisconsin exhibitors
 - G. New out-of-State exhibitorsExhibitors must keep their stalls and animals open to the public during hours designated by the Superintendent. All exhibitors are expected to decorate their stalls in an attractive manner.
- 3) Any horse in the draft horse classes must show the breeding and confirmation of the appropriate breed. The Superintendent or a committee of three horsemen reserves the right to review all entries. The Superintendent and/or the committee reserves the right to reject entries or exhibits not sufficiently fitted to be a credit to the breed represented.
- 4) **Ownership:** No animal shall be entered in the name of anyone other than the bona fide owner or owners, except leased animals shall be entered in the name of the lessee. All Belgians and Percherons must be the bona fide (owned or leased) property of the exhibitor 25 days prior to the date of the exhibit based upon the records of the appropriate breed registry except when otherwise specified. Leased animals are not eligible for "Bred and Owned by Exhibitor" classes. (Clydesdale Exhibitors – refer to the "Supplemental National Clydesdale Rules" for ownership requirements.)
- 5) Entries in individual halter classes must specify animal registration information (animal name, registration number, sire, dam). Hitch classes must be entered in advance but animals in the group need not be identified. Group classes can be entered at the Fair; animals in the group need not be identified.
- 6) Senior: horse three years old and over. Junior: horse under three years old
- 7) Mares shown in the Registered Mare Team, Unicorn, 4-horse or 6-horse classes are not eligible to be shown in the regular Team, Unicorn, 4-horse or 6-horse classes.
- 8) A brood mare is a mare who has raised a foal during the current year. Exhibitors may be required to produce evidence the mare has complied with this requisite if requested to do so by the judge, Superintendent or breed Secretary. A yeld mare is a mare who has not raised a foal during the current year. A mare that gave birth to a dead foal or a foal that died within 30 days of birth shall be classified as a yeld mare. A mare which was the donor of an embryo may be shown in either her correct age class or the yeld mare class. A donor mare and her embryo transfer foal may be shown in the mare and foal class.
- 9) A horse may be driven in only one open cart class and junior cart for a total of two cart classes. Ladies Cart Classes: Ladies are eligible to drive any exhibitor's horse not driven in Men's Cart or Mare Cart.
- 10) **Youth Classes:**
 - A. Youth Cart Classes are open to youth 17 years of age and under as of January 1st of the current year. The name of the driver must be listed on the entry form. Youth exhibitors must be accompanied by an adult.
 - B. Youth Teams classes are open to youth 17 years of age and under as of January 1st of the current year. Youth drivers must be accompanied by an adult. The class is judged on driving ability only.

C. Youth Showmanship classes are open to youth 17 years of age and under as of January 1st of the current year. The horse will be shown at halter.

D. Youth Decorating classes are open to youth 17 years of age and under as of January 1st of the current year. The class is judged on mane roll, tail tie and general presentation of the horse.

- 11) **Championship Classes:** Only first and second prize winners in the respective classes are eligible to compete for championship and reserve prizes. All first prize animals are required to show in championship classes unless excused by the Superintendent.
- 12) **Group Classes:** Group halter class horses must be owned by the individual or business firm exhibiting them and must have been shown in an individual halter class (except "Get of Sire" and "Produce of Dam" horses). Geldings are not eligible for group entry. Members of one family shall be allowed to exhibit their animals together in group and hitch classes as one exhibitor provided the horses are stabled and cared for as one herd on a permanent basis. Horses may be recorded in separate names of one immediate family.
- 13) **Wisconsin Bred and Owned classes:** The top two placing Wisconsin bred and owned Stallion or Mare in each Clydesdale class are eligible to compete in the Wisconsin bred and owned Stallion or Mare class. Entries must be bred in Wisconsin and owned by any Wisconsin Exhibitor.
- 14) **Show Ring:**
 - A) Attendants must wear the assigned exhibitor number and be properly dressed upon entering the show ring. Violation will result in exhibitor being excused from the class.
 - B) After a reasonable length of time has elapsed the gate will be closed and no more entries will be permitted to enter the ring.
- 15) **Awards:** No more than two premiums will be awarded to an exhibitor in one halter class. Only one premium will be awarded to an exhibitor in hitch classes (excluding youth classes).
- 16) Campers must be parked in the Wisconsin State Fair RV Park. Contact the RV Park at 414.266.7035 for availability and rates.

GROOM'S AWARD

A plaque and an **Andis Clipper** will be presented to the top groom in each breed by Wisconsin State Fair. Award criteria is based on exhibitors keeping their exhibits neat, a clean stalling area and making a positive impression to the public and show management.

BEST OF BREED

A banner will be presented to the winner chosen between the Grand Champion Stallion and the Grand Champion Mare.

PREMIER EXHIBITOR

A plaque and an **Andis Clipper** will be presented in each breed to an exhibitor accumulating the most points in individual halter classes and group classes. Only the top two entries per exhibitor will be counted per class. The entries must be owned and exhibited by the exhibitor. Family members of a respective farm will be considered as one owner. Points will be awarded as follows:

BELGIAN DRAFT HORSE CORPORATION SPONSORSHIP

The Belgian Draft Horse Corporation of America will provide a trophy for the Grand Champion Belgian Mare and the Grand Champion Belgian Stallion.

NATIONAL CLYDESDALE SHOW

These rules are supplemental to the rules and regulations listed previously.

- 1) Best American Bred Classes - To be eligible horses must be American bred by a mare registered with the Clydesdale Breeders of the U.S.A., foaled in the U.S.A. and be registered in the Stud Books of the Clydesdale Breeders of the U.S.A. Horses may be of any age. Previous winners are ineligible to compete. Horses must be shown in the appropriate line class to qualify for the Best American Bred class.
- 2) Ownership - To be eligible for competition, all animals must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor by the entry deadline (June 16) of the current year. An exception is made for leased animals, which must be exhibited by the lessee and the lease must be effective on or before the entry deadline (June 16) of the current year. Leased animals are not eligible for "Bred and Owned by Exhibitor" classes.
- 3) Produce of Mare and Get of Sire - Registered geldings are eligible provided they have been shown in either gelding halter class.
- 4) Under Saddle - Under saddle horses may be shown in any recognized riding discipline tack/attire (Western, Australian, English Saddleseat, Huntseat or Dressage). Choose a discipline and dress/tack appropriately according to that discipline. Horses may not be shown with blinder bridles. Participants should enter at a trot and will be shown at a walk and trot only in both directions of the ring. Passing slower horses at the trot is permissible. Horses will be asked to reverse on the rail at a walk. Horses will lineup, should stand quietly and will be asked to back.

- 5) Registration Papers - Registration papers, or a two sided copy, or a signed lease agreement on record with the Clydesdale Breeders of the U.S.A. and a copy of the leased animal's registration, must accompany the horses to the National Show. Papers will be checked by a representative of the Clydesdale Breeders of the U.S.A. All rules concerning dress and decorum will be enforced per request of the Clydesdale Breeders of the U.S.A.
