GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1) All exhibitors must have valid admission to enter the Fair Park August 4 – 14. Admission fees do not include vehicle parking! Entries, with the proper fees, must be submitted to Wisconsin State Fair prior to June 16th. Fees must accompany all applications for entry including the milking competition. Use a separate entry form for each breed division. Each exhibitor is limited to entering 50 head. Entry forms must contain complete information including class number, date of birth, tattoo, name and registration number. Entries without proper information will be returned. If barn capacity is exceeded, entries will be accepted using the following criteria in order:
 - A. Wisconsin goat exhibitors based on seniority of showing at the Wisconsin State Fair
 - B. New Wisconsin goat exhibitors
 - C. Out-of-State goat exhibitors based on seniority showing at the Wisconsin State Fair
 - D. New out-of-State goat exhibitors
- 2) All exhibits will receive the best care and protection the surroundings will afford, but they are at all times subject to the owner's risk.
- 3) No animals other than those entered will be permitted in the barn (unless newborn young).
- 4) All animals must be recorded through a national breed association. The original or a breed association issued duplicate copy of registration is acceptable. Faxes, emails and/or photo copies of registration papers will not be accepted.
- 4) Group Classes: only animals entered and shown in individual classes are eligible to compete.
- 5) Animals must be healthy, free of symptoms or evidence of infectious or transmissible disease such as, but not limited to: internal and/or external parasites, ringworm lesions, pinkeye or abscesses in any stage. In addition, all goats must be free of scabies, lice, foot-rot, sore mouth and have not been exposed to scrapie. All goats must be identified by scrapie tags, tattoos and registration numbers.
- 6) The use of feed dispensers for Fairgoers to feed goats is strictly prohibited.
- 7) Competition:
 - A. All milk goats exhibited must be registered with a recognized registry, and registry certificates must be presented to the Superintendent of the department at check in.
 - B. Goats must wear a collar while in the show ring.
 - C. All exhibitors must be properly dressed while in the show ring.
 - D. Does competing for championship honors in milk may be required to be milked in the show ring at the discretion of the Judge before final selection.
- 8) Wisconsin State Fair reserves the right to combine or break classes at the discretion of the Superintendent. Premiums will be paid to the top 2 entries in each class per exhibitor.
- 9) **All exhibitors who sell merchandise to Wisconsin State Fair customers** (Fairgoers and exhibitors) out of their existing space assigned as an animal exhibitor must obtain a permit prior to selling any merchandise. Permits for vending are \$25.00 per day. Contact Mary Kay Pfeffer in the Exhibitor Services Department at 414.266.4218. Exhibitors are strongly encouraged to purchase the permit prior to the Fair. Exhibitors requesting additional space for the purpose of selling merchandise will be charged on a scale more in line with our commercial Fair vendors ranging from \$60 to \$75 per frontage foot. Violators of this policy will not be allowed to sell merchandise and may be asked to leave the Fairgrounds.
- 10) In an effort to promote a positive image of the goat industry, exhibitors are requested to have pens cleaned by 7:00 am. No litter or waste feed should be put in drains.

PREMIER BREEDER

A plaque will be awarded in each breed to an exhibitor who will be recognized as the Premier Breeder of the respective show. The award will be based on the following criteria:

- ~Points will be earned in individual class placings.
- ~The top eight head at the show from the breeder will be used.
- ~The owner of the dam at the time of service shall be considered the breeder.
- ~Animals bred by a bona fide firm, co-partnership or corporation shall be considered as bred by the firm, co-partnership or corporation.
- ~Family members of a respective farm will be considered as one breeder.

THE AMERICAN DAIRY GOAT ASSOCIATION SPECIAL

The Wisconsin State Fair dairy goat show is an official show of the American Dairy Goat Association, Shirley Mackenzie, Association Manager, PO Box 865, Spindale, North Carolina 28160. The ADGA rules apply. The Junior and Senior Shows are separately sanctioned. The Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion does of each breed will be awarded special rosettes. The association also offers official recognition of animals exhibited.

The special awards offered and recognition of animals exhibited shall be in accordance with the rules of the ADGA for official shows.

MILKING COMPETITION

RULES

- 1) Entry Fee: \$6.00 per class. A \$12.00 late fee plus the original entry fee of \$6.00 for a total of \$18.00 per animal will be collected at check-in time if not entered by the entry deadline.
- 2) This show is sanctioned by ADGA and their rules shall govern. Does must be registered or recorded in the American Dairy Goat Association and proof of such registration must be shown. Does must be identified by tattoo and this information must be part of the official record in the ADGA office at the time of test.
- 3) Goats must be entered in their appropriate breeding class. Exhibitors must provide their own milking equipment. Goats must be milked into stainless buckets.
- 4) The owner shall certify in writing to the Superintendent and to ADGA the goat has not received milk, thyroprotein or any tonic or condition powder which states on the label it will increase milk production within 10 days of test. This certificate shall be completed and signed by the owner in the presence of the Competition Supervisor on the day of the milk-out.
- 5) Goats shall be milked dry and stripped dry in the show ring under supervision of the official tester 24 hours before the hour set for the final milking. Milkout will be at 6:00 pm, Friday, August 12th. Animals arriving late will be milked out upon arrival at the show under the same supervision of the official milkout.

- 6) There will be three milkings. The first milking will take place in the show ring at 6:00 pm, Friday, August 12th, the second will take place in the show ring at 6:00 am, Saturday, August 13th, and the final milking will take place at 6:00 pm the same day. Points will be awarded as follows:
- For each pound of milk, one point figured to one decimal.
 - For each complete ten days the goat has been in milk since last kidding one tenth (.1) of a point, with maximum of 3.6 points.
 - For each .05 pounds of butterfat yielded in the milkings, one point.
 - Information will be sent to ADGA for any animal earning 18 or more points for a Star Milker designation.

Exhibitors will only be awarded one premium per class.

DIVISION 22

A plaque will be awarded by the Wisconsin State Fair to the top four herdsman. Award criteria is based on exhibitors keeping their exhibits and stalling area clean in addition to making a positive impression to the public and show management.

CHAIRMAN'S AWARD

In an effort to promote a positive, professional image of agriculture and recognize excellent herdsman Wisconsin State Fair will be awarding Chairmans' Awards to the top herds in each species of the open livestock shows. Chairman Award Recipients will receive recognition during the 2011 Fair and will receive complimentary livestock entry fees for the 2012 Fair.

BOER GOAT SHOW DIVISION

This show is sanctioned by the American Boer Goat Association. Boer Goats will be housed in the Sheep & Goat Barn for the 2011 Fair.

RULES

- 1) **Entries:** Accepted until entry deadline unless barn capacity is reached prior to deadline. Fees must accompany all applications.
Entry Fee: \$6.00 per class.
Pen Fee: \$5.00 per pen.
Late Fee: A \$12.00 late fee plus the original entry fee of \$6.00 for a total of \$18.00 per animal will be charged if not entered by the entry deadline.
- 2) **Eligibility of Animals:** All goats must be registered in the herdbook of a recognized association and registered in the name of the exhibitor and must have been owned by the exhibitor on or before the entry deadline before time specified by the show. Recognized associations include ABGA, International Boer Goat Association, USBGA and the Canadian Boer Goat Association. Original registration certificates are required, though a copy of a registration application, stamped with the date received by one of the listed associations, can be accepted for kids less than 3 months of age. Throughout the ABGA and JABGA show rules, the term exhibitor is defined as the owner of the animal listed in the ABGA registry shown on entry deadline. All goats must be appropriately identified and comply with USDA Scrapie Eradication Program Guidelines. Call 1.866. USDA TAG (873.2824) or visit the following website for more information, http://www.aphis.usda.gov/animal_health/animal_diseases/scrapie/
- 3) **Ennobled Herd Book Points:** Only goats entered under their ABGA registration number and presenting their ABGA certificate of registration will be eligible to earn points for their actual placing in the show as described in the ABGA "Criteria for Ennoblement of a Boer Goat."
- 4) **Tattoos:** All goats must have legible tattoos or other means of permanent identification consistent with its registration certificate or the animal will be disqualified. Point winners from each class must have their tattoos read and recorded. The judge will be responsible for ensuring the tattoos are read and properly recorded. The show secretary will be responsible for recording the tattoos and informing the judge as to which goats need to be checked. If the animal has a microchip as its permanent identification, the exhibitor is responsible for providing a microchip reader.
- 5) **Bucks** must be washed daily and kept as odor free as possible. If a buck is deemed to be an odor problem and/or hazard by the Superintendent, the buck will be removed from the Fairgrounds.
- 6) **Classes** will be determined by the birthdates listed on the registration certificate. Progeny of fresh does will NOT be allowed in the ring. At the discretion of the judge and/or the Superintendent, goats may be let loose in the ring as a function of judging. Use of costumes and/or apparel is not permitted during an ABGA open sanctioned show.
- 7) **Divisions:** All animals must be registered purebred/fullblood or percentage blood Boer goats. Divisions are according to the chart below. Bucks 96.86% and lower are not eligible to be shown. The Champion and Reserve Champions will be chosen from the first and second place entries in that division of the show.
- 8) **Horned and disbudded goats** can compete together without prejudice.
